



## *16th Annual Student Bird Art Contest at Godwit Days*

**Co-sponsored by Friends of the Arcata Marsh (FOAM)  
and Redwood Region Audubon Society (RRAS)**

Humboldt County students from K through Grade 12  
are eligible to enter.

**Prizes:** At least \$550 to be awarded;  
divisions to be determined based on total number of entries received.  
Special prizes for best rendition of a bird in its natural habitat.

**Submission Rules:** One entry per student. **Maximum size of artwork, including any border material, is 8.5" x 11".** Subject must be a bird listed on the back of this flyer or another **locally occurring** species. Any medium may be used, as long as artwork is light enough to be push-pinned to a wall for display. **All entries other than paper collages that have glued-on components (e.g., glitter, twigs, grass) or are done in pastel chalk must be submitted in plastic sleeves.** Do not trace other art/photos. Do not frame. Write student's name, address, phone number, teacher name, e-mail, phone, grade number, and name of school legibly on back of entry, along with the species of bird being depicted.

**Return of Artwork:** It is highly recommended that classrooms and individuals entering the contest enclose a self-addressed envelope (minimum size, 9"x12"), with proper postage for oversized mail (see [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com) for rates). **Allow at least 2 weeks after Godwit Days ends (early May) for return.**

Return packages must weigh less than 13 ounces. Entries lacking return envelopes will be held at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center for 1 month for teachers or individuals to pick up.

**Announcement of Winners and Artwork Display:** Winners will be announced and awarded prizes at Godwit Days Spring Migration Bird Festival on Saturday, April 20. Our goal is to display all entries in the Arcata Community Center during the festival (April 19-21). Color copies of winning art will be displayed at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center during May and June. Winners' names will be published in FOAM and RRAS newsletters and sent to local media. A booklet containing all winning artwork and artist photos taken during the awards ceremony will be posted at [www.rras.org](http://www.rras.org) and [www.arcatamarshfriends.org](http://www.arcatamarshfriends.org).
